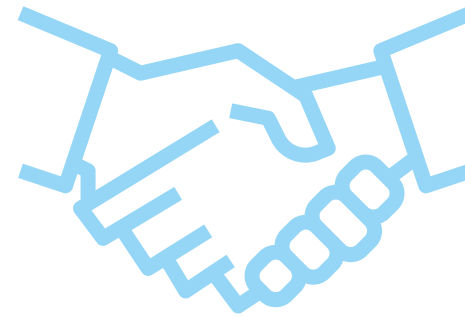
Interconnecting Histories and Archives for Migrant Agency

The European research project ITHACA investigates the historical causes, social transformations, and the political consequences of migration, starting from the experience **of women and men on the move**, through an interdisciplinary, comparative and transnational perspective.

ITHACA collects the narratives of migrants **in the past and present** in order to interpret them and make them available to migrants, scholars, associations, policy-makers and citizens living in Europe and beyond. To do this effectively, ITHACA is working on a **digital platform** that will contain an open access archive and digital tools such as apps for museums and cultural institutions.

ITHACA is composed by 11 partners – universities, international institutions and non governmental organisations – in areas of origin, transit and destination of migrants, from **Africa to Asia**, from **Europe** to the **Middle East**.

Through a network of over 50 stakeholders, ITHACA involves migrants, researchers, archivists, workers of international institutions and non-governmental organisations, **to move away from the view of migration as an “emergency”**, fostering an **informed public debate** and promoting **new national and European policies** of reception, inclusion and respect for human rights.
